Unlicensed motorcycle riders continue to be a traffic safety problem. In 2021, 63% of motorcycle operators killed in crashes in Texas did not have a motorcycle license at the time of the crash. All States require a motorcycle endorsement or license that is usually earned through the completion of a knowledge and skills

test, yet many riders choose to ride without obtaining it. There is a significant need to encourage riders to enhance their knowledge and skills by attending rider training courses and obtaining the proper license.
