# **Need To Get Your Class M (Motorcycle) License?**

## Here's what you should know to get started.

To obtain a Texas Class M license, you must first complete an approved entry-level motorcycle safety course. There are beginner, intermediate, and 3-wheel courses available. Choose the one that best fits your experience level.

It's about staying safe and legal on the road.



# **How to Get Your Motorcycle License**

A motorcycle (Class M) license is required to ride a motorcycle in Texas, even if you have a valid Texas driver license.

Follow the steps below to get your Texas motorcycle license!

#### Meet the Qualifications

- ☐ Have valid driver license, or
- ☐ Have a learner license, or
- ☐ Have a provisional driver license.

If you don't meet one of these qualifications, learn more about the <u>requirements for getting a</u> <u>motorcycle license</u>.

## Motorcycle Safety Course

- ☐ Find a school
- Successfully complete an approved motorcycle safety course.
- □ Obtain a certificate of completion (MSB-8).
- ☐ MSB-8 is effective for licensing for 24 months.

#### Gather your documents

- ☐ <u>U.S. Citizenship</u> or, if you are not a U.S. Citizen, <u>evidence of lawful presence</u>
- Texas Residency
- Identity
- Social Security Number
- ☐ Evidence of Texas Vehicle Registration\* for each vehicle you own. Registration must be current.
  - » Visit <u>Texas DMV vehicle registration</u> for more information (New Residents who are surrendering an out-of-state driver license only)
- ☐ Proof of Insurance\* for each vehicle you own
- ☐ Motorcycle Safety Course completion certificate (MSB-8)
- <u>Driver License Application</u>
  - » Check the Motorcycle: Yes

### Go to the DPS Licensing Office

- ☐ Making an <u>appointment</u> is encouraged.
- ☐ Provide your documents and
  - » Have a picture taken
  - » Pass the vision exam
  - » Pay the application fee.

- - » Bring a parent/legal guardian
  - » Take a Motorcycle Drive Test or apply for a J restriction.
  - » 15 year-olds may apply for an I restriction (under 250cubic centimeter piston displacement).
